Great North Museum



Beacon class visited the Great North Museum this week to find out more about animal skeletons and the Stone Age. It was a great opportunity to be hands on with artefacts and take part in fieldwork as scientists and historians. Lighthouse and Priory classes will be visiting in the coming weeks.

Ursula, one of our Rockcliffe reporters, said this about the visit:

In the museum we looked or Ice-Age artefacts. We found lots. I really liked it. Next, we got to look around the museum and we
